Position in the educational system

The course is given as a freestanding course.

Main field of studies

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Specialization

A1N, Second cycle, has only first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Entry requirements

Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts of at least 180 credits or the equivalent. Applicants must prove their knowledge of English: English 6/English B from Swedish Upper Secondary School or the equivalent level of an internationally recognized test, for example TOEFL, IELTS. In addition, approved work samples are required.

Learning outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course the student should be able to:

- show advanced understanding of the chosen field of study
- display an artistic work
- be able to present their work orally; in writing or in an equivalent way

Course content

In consultation with the professor, the student formulate their own project plan for the course. The student also has the opportunity to participate in programme courses.

The basis of the course is the student's own artistic work within their field of Ceramic, Jewellery or Textile Art

The focus is on the student's own artistic expression and is conducted through independent work under supervision.

Form of teaching

Language of instruction: Swedish

Assessment

For a passing grade, active attendance at the all course components is required.

The examiner assesses the artistic work and the oral and/or written presentation.

The student has the right to change examiner after having failed twice. The application shall be sent to the board of the department and has to be in writing.

Grades

The grading scale comprises: Pass (G) and Fail (U).

Course evaluation

Upon completion of the course, the course is evaluated together with the teachers.
