# Course content

Assessment is about supporting and evaluating learning. The focus in the course is based on research and experiences of educational assessment. The content is presented from a broad and inclusive perspective on various educational contexts, aims, content and methods. The course highlights questions about different actors, interpretations and implications at the individual and system level. Course content is organized in four main areas:

## • Conditions and prerequisites

- Policy documents, organization, similarities and differences with regard to individual and group-related conditions and factors

• Basic concepts of assessment

- Objectives, knowledge definitions, assessment and analysis perspective, actors, effects and consequences; concepts of validity and reliability

- Assessment methods
- Different forms of assessment at local, national and international level
- Documentation and communication

- Various forms of documentation, individual development plans, written reviews, programs, portfolios. Different forms of communication about assessment.

## Form of teaching

Teaching is conducted through lectures, literature seminars, group discussions and peer to peer discussions.

# Assessment

The assessment of the stated learning outcomes will be made through:

- 1. An individual written assignment
- 2. Active participation in group discussions about course literature
- 3. Leading a group discussion of course literature
- 4. Providing written and verbal feedback in peer groups

In groups tasks, individual performance should be distinguishable. Students have the right to change their examiner after failing twice on the same examination. A request for changing examiners must be made to the department in writing. The number of attempts on an examination is limited to five. In the event that the course has been discontinued or has undergone major changes, students are guaranteed at least three attempts at the examination (including the initial attempt) based on the previous course structure for a period of at least one year.

## Grades

The grading scale comprises: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U). Grading criteria can be found in the course guide.

## **Course evaluation**

The course is evaluated in relation to the learning outcomes at the end of the course. Students who have taken the course have the opportunity to express their views and comments anonymously in the course evaluation. The result of the evaluation with the course leader's comments will be communicated to the students after the course.
