In the second part of the course, you'll have a choice among various books. You will receive more details about these books in the introductory lecture and the first seminar. Therefore, you may opt to wait until after these sessions to order the books for the latter part of the course. However, it's crucial that you order the two books by Noll and the one by Dayton early on. Most of these texts are available as e-books.

Regarding the optional readings:

- 1. **Millies vs. Reno**: Millies, a Catholic political theorist, traces the history of Catholicism in America, especially over the last 50 years, leading up to Trump's presidency. Reno, a Catholic theologian and ethicist, offers a different perspective of the post-1945 social, cultural, and political developments. While Millies criticizes Catholic backing of the Republican party and Donald Trump, Reno offers a qualified intellectual understanding and support of the type of populist nationalism partly responsible for Trump's support.
- 2. **Denker vs. Alberta**: For an "inside" or "ethnographic" view of recent developments, you will choose between two journalistic (and also more personal) accounts. Denker is a pastor and journalist whose book was first published in 2019 (updated edition in 2022). Alberta is a famous American political journalist, whose book was published in December 2023. It was written in the period after Denker's book was published
- 3. **Du Mez vs. Whitehead/Perry**: The historian du Mez tackles gender issues, while sociologists Whitehead and Perry focuses on Christian nationalism.
