#### **Entry requirements**

To be admitted to the course, 37.5 credits of Film studies is required.

#### **Learning outcomes**

On successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

*Knowledge and understanding*

- give an account of basic Film studies methods and work procedures

*Competence and skills*

- review how various media and art forms can interact concerning format, production and reception

*Judgement and approach*

- form an opinion on the usefulness of different methods related to various Film studies materials.

**Course content**

The course provides students with knowledge of Film studies methods and procedures and how these apply to the study of different films or film contexts.

**Form of teaching**

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and group assignments.

*Language of instruction:* English and Swedish

**Assessment**

The students will be assessed through individual take-home exams and examination seminars.

If a student who has failed a compulsory element twice would like to have a different examiner at the next evaluation, such a request should be made in writing to the department. The request should be granted if possible (Chapter 6, Section 22, Higher Education Ordinance).

Should a course be discontinued or has undergone significant changes, the student is guaranteed at least three examinations (including the ordinary examination) during a period of at least one year up to two years after the course has been discontinued/changed. Regarding internships/placements, the equivalent applies but is limited to only one additional examination session.

**Grades**

The grading scale comprises: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U).

**Course evaluation**

The result and any changes in the course structure must be communicated to both the students who completed the evaluation and to the students who will start the course.

**Additional information**
