Course content

The course mainly deals with the journalistic specializations data journalism and investigative journalism.

Sub-courses

1. Data Journalism and Visualization (*Datajournalistik och visualisering*), 9 credits Grading scale: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U) Learning outcomes covered in this course:

2. Investigative journalism: Theoretical perspectives (Undersökande journalistik: Teori), 5 credits

- 4. Internship preparation (Praktikförberedande kurs), 1 credits
