Learning outcomes

On successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- relate the composition and technology of a painting to its condition
- develop conservation proposals and outline treatments
- outline different treatments and their application for the conservation of canvas paintings

Competence and skills

- carry out and proritize conservation measures including consolidation and stabilization of both structural and paint coatings
- explain, test and carry out conservation interventions including cleaning, unloading and retouching of paintings

Judgement and approach

- assess and evaluate the consequences of different materials and treatments used in the conservation of paintings
- recommend treatments and preventive measures based on current research within the field of specialization painted surfaces
- evaluate ethical and aesthetic considerations regarding the choice, execution and impact of conservation procedures

Course content

The course deepens the student's practical skills to independently carry out active and passive conservation of paintings following knowledge gained through the course KKV701, Specialization: Painted surfaces I.Treatments on canvas include stabilization, consolidation, cleaning, reintegration and varnishing as well as preventive measures. The course comprises analysis of interventions and documention as well as ethical and aesthetic considerations regarding the conservation and treatment of canvas paintings. Departing from a given painted object in its specific context, the student is trained to predict and evaluate the consequences of different conservation methods, as well as argue for the choice of appropriate approach.

Form of teaching

Under supervision, implementation of practical, independent work in the form of conservation measures including analysis and documentation of objects in the lab and studio.

Language of instruction: English

Assessment

The student is examined by: Examination 1: Oral Presentations (3 credits) Examination 2: Written report (6 credits) Examination 3: Practical Conservation Measures (6 credits)

If a student, who has failed the same examined component twice, wishes to change examiner before the next examination, a written application shall be sent to the department responsible for the course and shall be granted unless there are special reasons to the contrary (Chapter 6, Section 22 of Higher Education Ordinance).

In cases where a course has been discontinued or has undergone major changes, the student shall normally be guaranteed at least three examination occasions (including the ordinary examination) during a period of at least one year from the last time the course was given.

Grades

The grading scale comprises: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U).

Course evaluation

The results of and possible changes to the course will be shared with students who participated in the evaluation and students who are starting the course.
