Bachelor Degree of Fine Arts in film of 180 credits or the equivalent as well as knowledge in English equivalent English B/English 6.

Learning outcomes

On successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account and reflect on how a filmic material can communicate a described inquiry

Competence and skills

- present and discuss own and other's film works in relation to ethics, aesthetics, context and theme
- reflect on how their own filmic works relate to the surrounding society

Judgement and approach

- reflect on their own artistic positions on the basis of a social context, both contemporary and historical.
- analyse and formulate descriptions of other's visual works on the basis of a situational analysis.

Course content

The course aims to develop the ability to reflect and formulate on others and their own filmic expression in terms of ethics, aesthetics, context and thematics.

By taking part of and discuss different examples of filmic ideas, the course gives exercise in to regard of filmic interpretations from different social and temporal aspects. During the course the ability to review and identify the importance on how the surrounding society's relates to their own filmic work as well as the ability to elaborate own inquires as a basis for film works are developed.

The course is based largely on a close collaboration with the work in the course Film Practice I.

Form of teaching

The course will be implemented in the form of: lectures, seminars, own work, individual supervision, oral presentations and group discussions.

Language of instruction: English and Swedish

Assessment

The learning outcomes is assessed orally through assessing seminars and written through written assignments. In case of absence, examination through equivalent written report is arranged.

If a student, who has been failed on the same examining course component twice, wishes a change of examiner before the next examination session, a request of this kind is to be sent in writing to the department responsible for the course, and granted, unless there are special reasons to the contrary (Chapter 6, Section 22, Higher Education Ordinance).

Grades

The grading scale comprises: Pass (G) and Fail (U).
