### **SP1112 Spanish, Online Introductory Course 2, 7.5 credits**

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#### **Confirmation**

This course syllabus was confirmed by Department of Languages and Literatures on 2014-09-11 and was last revised on 2022-08-24 to be valid from 2022-08-29, autumn semester of 2022.

#### **Position in the educational system**

The course SP1112, Spanish, web-based Basic course II (7.5 credits), is given as a freestanding course at first cycle level and may be included in a Bachelor's degree with Spanish as main field of study.

The course can be part of the following programme: 1) International Language Programme (H1ISP)

Spanish

*Specialization*

G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary level entry requirements

#### **Entry requirements**

General entry requirements and Spanish 3. Alternatively, completed course Practical Spanish (SP1001/SP0500/SP0600), Orientation course in Spanish (SP1600), Spanish, beginners course 2 (SP1032).

#### **Learning outcomes**

On completion of the course, the student is expected to be able to:

*Knowledge and understanding*

- reflect on his/her own learning and the importance of the knowledge gained in the course for the surrounding society;

#### *Competence and skills*

- apply simple theoretical concepts in textual analysis;
- show awareness of the relationship between text and context and at a basic level account for this with regard to the texts that are studied during the course;

#### *Judgement and approach*

- comment and evaluate texts of different kinds critically;
- critically reflect on language learning in general and his/her own learning process in particular.

### **Course content**

Text, Culture and Society 1 7.5 *Higher Education Credit*

The course focuses on the study and discussion of present-day Spanish-speaking texts including an overview of basic terminology for textual analysis. The course deals with culture and social situations in connection with the texts that are studied.

### **Form of teaching**

All teaching is web-based.

*Language of instruction:* Spanish and Swedish

### **Assessment**

To what extent the student has achieved the aim of the course is assessed through written tests and written assignments and web-based seminars.

A student who has failed a course item is eligible for a retake exam/assignment. In connection with written assignments, supplementary assignments may be offered in order for the student to achieve a Pass grade. Such a supplementary assignment should be done within the stipulated time (normally five working days after the result has been posted). Otherwise a Fail grade will be reported.

A student who has completed an exam/assignment with a passing grade is not eligible for a retake for the purpose of receiving a higher grade. Nor may a student withdraw a test/assignment once it has been submitted for the purpose of avoiding receiving a grade for the work.

A student who has taken two examinations in a course or a part of a course without obtaining a passing grade is entitled to the nomination of another examiner unless there

are special reasons to the contrary (HF 6 chap. 22§). Such a request should be made in writing to the department responsible for the course.

If the University of Gothenburg has decided that a student is eligible for special study support, the examiner may, provided it is compatible with the aim of the course and it can be done within the scope of available resources, decide to offer the student an adjusted examination or a different examination format.

If the course has been discontinued or substantially revised, a student should be guaranteed to sit the examination on at least three occasions (including the ordinary examination occasion) during a period of at least one year, but not later than two years after the course was discontinued or revised. As regards internships/placement the same as above applies, with the exception that examination is offered on only one occasion.

### **Grades**

The grading scale comprises: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U).

For the final grade of Pass with distinction, this grade is required on at least half of the total number of the course credits, i.e. in all at least 4 credits.

### **Course evaluation**

The students are given the opportunity to make a written evaluation of the course. The results of the evaluation are published digitally

### **Additional information**

The SP1112 course in Spanish, Web-based Introductory course 2, 7.5 credits, corresponds to a part of the course SP1103, Spanish, Introductory course, 30 credits. Together with the SP1111, SP1113 and SP1114 courses, the SP1112 course corresponds to the SP1103 course. The SP1112 course may therefore not be included in a degree together with SP1103 or one of its equivalents Introductory course in Spanish (SP1100), Introductory course I in Spanish (SP1101) and Introductory course II in Spanish (SP1102).

Modules that previously applied to students within H1ISP, the International Language Programme, have been removed from the course. According to the decision that no admissions will be made to ISP until further notice (15 December 2021, GU 2021/3212) "students within the International Language Programme H1ISP who have not completed modules within Career Planning as part of a language course but have otherwise completed courses as stipulated by the syllabus are entitled to a course certificate." For students who study the course SP1112 as part of ISP to be entitled to a course certificate, they only need to complete the ordinary course provided that all the other courses stipulated by the syllabus have been completed.

Equality aspects should be taken in consideration in content, literature, teaching and evaluation.
