# Position in the educational system

The course is offered as a freestanding course.

### **Entry requirements**

The requirement for admission to the course is 30 credits from the introductory course in Spanish (SP1103 or the equivalent) and at least 22.5 credits from the intermediate course in Spanish (SP1210 or the equivalent).

### **Learning outcomes**

On successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

• account for and problematise literary concepts, problems and theories;

• independently account for literary texts in relation to their cultural, literary and historical contexts:

### Competence and skills

- use the language at a level corresponding to C1 with regard to listening and reading comprehension, oral/written interaction and written proficiency in Spanish according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages;
- formulate a literary problem of relevance for Spanish literature and culture in relation to the historical and sociocultural context;
- seek, evaluate and adopt relevant concepts and methods in literary analysis;
- evaluate and seek relevant secondary sources to be able to independently analyse and interpret Spanish literature;

## Judgement and approach

- problematise his/her own position as a reader during the reading process;
- identify his/her need for further knowledge.

### **Course content**

The course contains exercises that develop the student's academic approach to literary and theoretical texts. The course furthermore provides an increased awareness of different readings and theoretical approaches to texts and gives the historical context of the texts and the readings.

For students on the International Language Programme who were admitted before the autumn term of 2017, one credit represents the module of career planning. Students in the International language programme that were admitted in the autumn semester of 2017 or later read Career guidance to the extent that is stated in the revised programme syllabus of the programme valid from the autumn term of 2017.

### Form of teaching

Seminars and written and oral presentations.

Language of instruction: Spanish

### **Assessment**

The course is examined in an integrated form through written assignments, discussion for aand a home exam.

A student who has failed a course item is eligible for a retake exam/assignment. In connection with written assignments, supplementary assignments may be offered in order for the student to achieve a Pass grade. Such a supplementary assignment should be done within the stipulated time (normally five working days after the result has been

posted). Otherwise a Fail grade will be reported.

A student who has completed an exam/assignment with a passing grade is not eligible for a retake for the purpose of receiving a higher grade. Nor may a student withdraw a test/assignment once it has been submitted for the purpose of avoiding receiving a grade for the work.

A student who has failed a test twice has the right to change examiner, if it is possible. A written request must then be submitted to the Department.

If the course has been discontinued or substantially revised, a student should be guaranteed to sit the examination on at least three occasions (including the ordinary examination occasion) during a period of at least one year based on the previous course structure. As regards internships/placement the same as above applies, with the exception that examination is offered on only one occasion.

### **Grades**

The grading scale comprises: Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U). For the final grade of Pass with distinction, this grade is required on at least half of the total number of the course credits.

#### Course evaluation

The students are given the opportunity to make a written evaluation of the course. The results of the evaluation are published digitally.

#### **Additional information**

The course cannot be part of a degree together with SP1301, Spanish, in-depth course, 15 credits.
